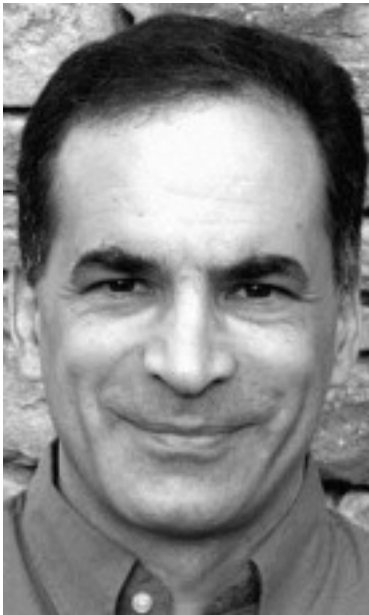


Brothers from the Taize community in France are visiting Massachusetts.
