What helps us get there is consenting to the Lord's desire to purify us and prepare our hearts for heaven, a process that is not comfortable at first but, as Lewis points out, marks the beginning of lasting joy.

And so it was that on some warm evenings in August, the parishoners of St. Anne's & St. Patrick's, along with others from nearby parishes, joined us in an imaginary tour of lives and life-choices. It was the occasion of laughter, thoughtfulness and discussion.
