Assumption College Students to Take Pilgrimage Walk for Mercy on Sunday as Part of Lenten Observance

WHAT: Members of the Assumption College community will participate in a pilgrimage walk beginning at the College's Campus and ending at St. Paul's Cathedral in downtown Worcester as part of Assumption's observance of Lent and Pope Francis's declaration of the Year of Mercy.

DETAILS: Carrying on a tradition of pilgrimages sponsored by the Assumptionists, the sponsoring order of the College, this 3.2 mile (5K) walk will start with a brief prayer service in the Chapel of the Holy Spirit at 12 p.m. The walk will take the group through Worcester, ending at St. Paul's Cathedral where they will meet students from other Worcester colleges for a prayer service and social gathering around 2 p.m. Participants are encouraged to bring non-perishable

food to share with the St. Paul's Cathedral Food Pantry. All members of the community are welcome to participate.

The Extraordinary Jubilee Year of Mercy, as declared by Pope Francis, is being celebrated from December 8th, 2015 to November 20, 2016. During this time, Pope Francis calls all Catholics to be profound witnesses to mercy and to "find the joy rediscovering and rendering fruitful God's mercy, with which we are all called to give comfort to every man and every woman of our time."
