

On Sunday, March 18<sup>th</sup>, the Assumptionist Center focused on the theme, "Student Life in God's Plan." The presenter for the morning was Stephanie McCaffrey, Associate Director of Campus Ministry at Assumption College. An M. Div. graduate from Weston Jesuit School of Theology, Stephanie's responsibilities include directing Assumption's retreat program and works closely with campus ministry's student leaders. She also advises Advocates for Life and serves as chaplain to the Women's Swim Team.

In her presentation, Stephanie elaborated on the reasons why young men and women come to college based on her experience at Assumption.
