In October of 1904 at 27 Fales Street in the Greenleaf section of Worcester, four teachers (two Assumptionists and two laymen), Our Lady of Consolation Apostolic School (Misses Seminary) of the Fathers of the Assumption opened its doors to 4 students. (who each paid room, board and tuition of \$ 30 per month).

In 1912, the College de Assumption (now on Baltimore Avenue) was issued a charter of incorporation as Assumption College, now authorized to award Bachelor of Arts degrees.
