The Church outside of Boston: Understanding the Mission of Reconciliation in Rwanda

At this conversation, we are delighted to have Fr. Marcel Uwineza, SJ share with us his experience of the Rwandan genocide and how it has shaped his faith journey and self-understanding as a priest. Through Fr. Marcel's story, we will open up the conversation to reflect on the complexity of reconciliation in the church of Africa, and what it means for us to be Church as a whole.

Fr. Marcel is a Jesuit priest who is currently completing his licentiate in Systematic Theology at the School of Theology and Ministry, Boston College. He has published several articles and book reviews on reconciliation in Rwanda, as well as on issues around inculturation in the church of Africa. His pastoral experiences include being the Director of the Good Jesus AIDS Project in Bujumbura (Burundi) in 2011, as well as the Asst. Director of the African Jesuit AIDS Network in Nairobi (Kenya) from 2007-2009.
