He taught at the Catholic University of Paris, Saint Augustine University of Kinshasa, Catholic University of Lille, and the Catholic University of Lyon. He is the Secretary-General in charge of Formation for the Augustinians of the Assumption (Assumptionists) and lives in Rome.
