



On Sunday, August 28th, 2011, on the feast of Saint Augustine, the Assumptionists celebrated the fifth anniversary of their arrival in [Sokode \(Togo\)](#).

On that occasion, six young Togolese made their first commitment in the Assumptionist religious family. The celebration, presided by Fr. Michel Carrière, assistant to the Provincial of France, Fr. Benoît Gschwind, took place in the parish of Our Lady of the Assumption, administered by the Assumptionists in the city of Sokode.



Having five years of experience under their belt, the religious involved in this mission are very acutely aware of the immensity of the task that is theirs. They have modestly assumed their share of work by taking on responsibility for a parish, by investing in youth and in vocation ministry, by collaborating in social communication at the diocesan and national levels, and by becoming involved in other quite varied works such as prison ministry, the accompaniment of couples, ministry to communities of sisters, the publication of booklets for young people, for couples, for small Christian communities, etc.
